# Licensing and Product Renewal Year 3 and Support of Business Plan Update

- Validated third year commitment of post-secondary community
- Clarified and confirmed invoicing procedures with BCAHC year three
- Confirmed for Ovid and Ebsco year three costs for licensed products
- Reviewed licenses for Ovid, Ebsco, and APA for year three renewals.
- Mitigated the affects of CRKN potential licensing of APA products so no e-HLbc non-CRKN members' access to PyscINFO & PsyARTICLES is compromised
  - Participated in teleconference between CRKN representatives and other regional consortia across the country
  - Hosted local meeting between CRKN representatives and other regional consortia across the country
  - Nominated to a four person working group which will provide strategies so that no current APA licensor will be orphaned by CRKN potential licensing of APA content
  - Engaged in discussions with vendor and publisher providers of APA material in order to reduce complexity and maintain continuous access to core suite of materials across postsecondary and health authority members.
- Preliminary work for core suite renewal in process
  - Initiating investigation of any new potential government agencies or institutions not previously included on core resource licenses
  - Gathering information about FTE/head counts from membership, any new government agencies or institutions not previously included on core resource licenses.

- Initiating clarification of proper names, contact information for authorized user list
- Developing content analysis of current full-text, comparing with other vendor full-text options

- Completed pilot member projects
  - Physiotherapy Association of BC (PABC) 7- month trial September 1, 2007 - March 31, 2008.
  - Massage Therapists' Association of BC (MTABC) 5 -month trial November 1, 2007 - March 31, 2008.
- Finalized content and administrative fee structure for affiliate membership for 2008-2009 in collaboration with Membership Committee
- Agreement of Physiotherapy Association of BC and the Massage Therapist's Association of BC to renew their affiliate membership for 2008-2009.
- Sent affiliate membership inquiries to several associations: the BC Association of Optometrists, the BC Pharmacy Association, the British Columbia Dental Hygienists' Association, Dietitians of Canada, BC Region and the Midwives Association of BC.
